Advent is a time of expectant waiting and preparation for Christmas. "All Creation waits with eager longing" (Romans 8:19) for the deep connection with God that the birth of Jesus brings. Advent 2022 begins Sunday, November 27 and ends Saturday, December 24.

For Advent 2022 Pullen is offering you a beautiful Advent Daily Reflection Guide based on Laudato

Si': on Care for our Common Home by Pope Francis. The meditations were originally published in 2015.

Each week of Advent we'll be sending you the Daily Meditations for that week. In the meantime you can see all of them here.

- The first week of Advent: Daily meditations with Laudato Si' (Pope Francis, 2015)
- Week 2 of Advent meditations with Laudato Si': Shift to a deeper vision
- Week 3 of Advent meditations with Laudato Si': Putting ourselves out there
- Week 4 of Advent meditations with Laudato Si': Can I be all embracing?

Before Advent begins you may want to watch <u>The Letter: A Message for our Earth</u>, a 2022 feature-length documentary film telling the story of *Laudato Si'*. <u>Here's the trailer</u>. Its premiere was in October and within two weeks it had over 7 million views.

The film features environmental champions from around the world, from different faiths and worldviews. Each represents an unheard voice in conversations on the planetary crisis. These are the voices of the Indigenous, the young, the poor, and wildlife. Through the film, we follow their journeys from the Amazon, India, Senegal, and Hawai'i to the Vatican. They meet Pope Francis, who shares his vision in beautifully human interactions. They find new hope for our planet in each other.

Wishing you an Advent season full of deep meaning, contemplation and joy!



Responding to the "Rallying Cry" to Support Elementary School Student Needs

Do you have an hour a week to make a positive impact in supporting a child's learning? An earlier Pullen newsletter article this fall described the critical need to help young students as they recover from the learning losses they experienced during the pandemic. The N&O and NYT have recently reported the "devastating effects" on schoolchildren and a call to action. Prior to the pandemic, the Pullen-Wiley Partnership provided Wednesday after-school tutoring at Pullen on Wednesdays. This academic school year, we are shifting gears so that we can broaden opportunities to respond to the current needs facing students.

Our own Kathy Foglia, Wiley Elementary School literacy specialist, is providing a research-based (also simple-to-use!) reading fluency model called HELPS for Pullen volunteers to use at Wiley during the school day (morning or afternoon times available). In addition, Pullen is providing space for an YMCA after-school program that meets Monday - Thursday for selected Fred Olds Elementary students. Tutor/mentors are needed between 4:30 - 5:45 to help students with homework as well as HELPS-aligned reading practice.
