An Invitation to Formation

In seminary I was taught that, if we are to interpret scripture in a faithful way, we needed to engage the practice in community. I think the same is true when it comes to interpreting the times. That is, making sense of what is happening in the world, and discerning what God requires of us to live faithfully in the present and shape the future that we believe is possible. When we engage in this practice together our perspective is broadened, our assumptions are challenged, and we find support in our efforts to embody God's kingdom and grace in our missteps along the way. This fall, we're offering many opportunities to be formed

together in Sunday Groups!

We'll continue conversations about race and privilege, engage scripture, share the wisdom of our own sacred stories, and develop tools to ground our work and enrich our lives. There are many groups to choose from because there's a lot to talk about! We hope you will find something that peaks your interest or speaks to your passion. With many options comes smaller class sizes, inviting deeper engagement of the subject matter. It also gives us an opportunity to get to know each other. If you're a newer member or attendee looking to connect with others in the Pullen community, this is a great opportunity. If you're looking for an accomplice in the work you feel called to, you may just find that person in a Sunday Group. Take a moment to look at the list of offerings below. Sunday Groups begin on September 18, and meet from 9:30 – 10:30 am. We have groups that run 10 weeks, and others that meet for 4-5 sessions. We also look forward to bringing some of our long-running Sunday Groups back to in-person gatherings. I know you're just getting settled into summer, but we want to give you plenty of time to consider how you want to engage. Faith formation is the work of the entire community. It's one of the many ways we show up for one another. I'm inviting you to join us for Sunday Groups this fall!

<u>September 18 – November 20</u>

Bible Basics - This is the ideal course for anyone seeking a solid introduction to the Bible or who has lingering questions about it. The Bible is the central document of our faith, but few know it very well. The course will address questions like: Where did the Bible Porterfield. How factual is the Bible - is it all just myths and stories? What are the major themes of the Bible and what's essential to know for a faith-filled life? How do I speak positively about the Bible in the face of literalism on the one hand and dismissiveness on the other? This course will be led by Pullen member Rev. Dr. Nick Carter, an ordained ABC minister and President Emeritus of Andover Newton Theological School.

Discoverers - Class members are leading the topic "What's on My Mind in These Days. " For each session, the facilitator sends the topic with a very short description or reading several days ahead but no advance preparation is required.

Exploring the Bible - This group is a Bible study class led by a rotating team of teachers, each leading several weeks to focus on various themes or Books of the Bible. The format involves lectures and lots of open discussion with classes taught by those with a background in Religion or Theology. There are no prerequisites to this class; no Bible study experience is necessary.

Pullen 101 – This class designed to introduce newcomers to our ministry and mission. Topics include our Pullen identity, history, theology, worship, Baptist identity, missions and education. In each session, a church member shares why he or she is at Pullen. The class provides an opportunity to get to know Pullen people and staff.

Spiritual Practices - This group gathers to practice meditation using the breath, voice, and body.

September 18 – October 16

Giving Voice to the POC Experience – Our Associate Pastor, Chalice Overy, will lead this time of sharing for People of Color in our church community. We will explore the wisdom of our own spiritual heritages, talk about what it is like to be a person of color in a predominantly White congregation, and consider how we can bring our whole selves to this community. To encourage a safe, hospitable space for sharing, this group is open to People of Color. We hope holding this space will help broaden conversations about anti-racism in the wider congregation.

LGBTQIA+ Spiritual Care – This course will excavate the Christian tradition for resources of spiritual resilience and flourishing for queer people. The course is open to allies, but will center the experiences of LGBTQIA+ people and their struggle for liberation and wholeness. Participants will walk away with practical tools for communal care and accompaniment in the ongoing struggle for queer justice. This course is led by Ian McPherson, Interim Minister for Missions and Young Adults.

Living Faithfully – This course is designed to help participants to define White privilege, to understand who are the privileged and the underprivileged, what difference does it make to us, and what can we do about it? Who will be our guide? There is a focus scripture for each week to help us value the importance of what God would have us do about living in the midst of White privilege. This course will be led

by Rev. Dr. Deborah Carter ordained minister in the American Baptist Churches (ABC), pastoral psychotherapist, AAPC Fellow and Intentional Interim Minister.

October 30 - November 20

Doing Our Work -- A series of conversations led by Pullen's Anti-racism Committee.

Spirituality, Theology & Health – This course is designed for discussion about our faith and what it has to do with our health. We will explore this through the faiths of Christian, Muslim and Jewish traditions, and will focus on a passage from a sacred text each week. When we are anxious, angry, fearful, uncertain, what helps restore us to a place of well-being? The Talk – This course is for parents looking to support their children in developing a healthy sexuality. Participants will learn the stages of development and receive tools to guide and affirm their children in the process. A trained professional is being identified to lead this course.

The Wisdom Way of Being -- Embedded (and some would say hidden) inside the Christian tradition and lineage is a wisdom path that winds through the very heart of Christianity, where we meet the hearts of all religions. Cynthia Bourgeault is a modern day mystic, Episcopal priest, writer and retreat leader who seeks to recover the Christian contemplative and wisdom path. This class will consist of three modules, each centered on one of Cynthia's books, the first of which is The Wisdom Way of Knowing. Our gatherings will be a mix of contemplative practices versus a traditional "discussion" of the text, a deliberate design that works to move us out of the head/brain and toward three-centered knowing. All are welcome to this course taught by Karla Oakley!



Worship from a Different Perspective!

Celebrating a Move-In

On June 29, HCP Participant Onyx, moved into her new apartment. This beautiful day almost didn't happen.

Wake County approved her housing voucher in May. The catch is that Onyx needed to find an open place to live that accepts the voucher within 30 days of approval. It's always been a short clock to find a unit, but these days it is incredibly difficult. More and more people are losing their housing voucher before they even have a chance to use them.

Our Housing Navigator worked every angle to find an available unit and found one that would open up 3 days <u>after</u> the voucher expired. Thankfully, her Transition Specialist

worked with Wake County for an extension that made it possible for Onyx to keep her voucher until it was possible to sign the lease. She moved in on June 29 and is ready to continue her journey to a safe and stable future.

Thank you for supporting this work. Because of you, our former foster youth have an experienced and dedicated team committed to helping them navigate this incredibly tight market.

STEM Camp: Teen Programs

The week of June 27th, we hosted a STEM camp for our teens at HCP. One of our volunteers who is a student at NC State wrote a grant to provide this programming for our youth. He donated a 3D printer that the teens used to bring their visions to life. Teens also made and launched rockets behind our building.
