Joys and Concerns

We rejoice with the members of our community celebrating milestones: Pullen is more than a "welcoming" or "affirming" congregation. Far beyond centering the church as the holder of the holy, we recognize that our LGBTQIA+ siblings bring our worshipping community closer to the divine. In fact, we believe that Christianity is an inherently "queer" project; that is, a love-fueled, boundary-crossing revolution for justice.

The Christian story is one of holy disruption and shattered binaries. In the person of Jesus, we see divisions between heaven/earth, divine/human, sacred/profane, foolishness/wisdom, and even life/death disrupted for the sake of a more just and loving world.

Rejected and erased for far too long, the queerness embodied by the LGBTQIA+ community is not merely a gift to the church today. It is a much-needed reminder of who the church was called to be all along. It shatters the binaries that separate us from our transgressive God, from one another, and from the fullness of who each of us was lovingly created to be.


Parental Conversations 2nd Thursdays at 6:30 pm at Trophy on Maywood

Congress Can Act on Composting

People and communities of faith have a huge opportunity to help advance large scale composting in our country! Worldwide, about 33% of soil is degraded. In the United States, soil is disappearing 10 times faster than it's being replenished naturally. Composting helps build healthy soils and increases the ability of soils to store carbon, thereby combating global warming while protecting water resources, increasing agricultural productivity, and increasing food production. A massive investment in a large scale composting infrastructure is needed to address America's food waste challenge and replenish US soils. There are two bills in the

US Congress that address this pending crisis: The bipartisan Federal Recycling and Composting Accountability Act (S. 3743) and The Compost Act, (H.R. 4443 and S 2388).

<u>Please take 5 minutes to encourage Congress to Act on both Composting Bills</u> by using this easy online advocacy tool.

By entering your name and address, the tool will automatically generate a call, an email, <u>or</u> a tweet to your own members of Congress (both Senators and your Representative). The tool includes a sample email message, phone script, and tweet, all of which can be modified to better reflect your ideas.
