City of Oaks Marathon Support: Novermber 5 during the City of Oaks Marathon



It's happening! Our recently launched housing partnership with St. Augustine's University is off to a great start! Currently we have one suite on campus, with hopes to expand. The dorm-style suite offers four bedrooms, two bathrooms, and a large common space. More importantly it gives us a new safe housing option for young adults in our programs who need transitional housing. It also offers an introduction to college life for our clients, which we hope will inspire our youth to pursue post-secondary education. Partnerships like this are so important to our work

because they expand our reach so we can help more former foster youth and show our youth that the community is here to support them.
