# Take the Journey with Jesus This Holy Week

As we have spent Lent listening with the ears of our hearts, we enter into Holy Week hoping for a fresh word from this familiar story. Once again, we come alongside Jesus as he journeys through his final days on earth.

**Palm Sunday** - Once again, we will wave our palms and shout hosanna as we accompany Jesus on his triumphal entry into Jerusalem through our intergenerational Palm Sunday worship service. If you want to participate in the processional, please gather in front of the Gregg Museum at 10:40 am.

Maundy Thursday – Shouts of praise turn to somber resignation on Thursday. Jesus returns to Jerusalem with his disciples for Passover. In an Upper Room, he washes the disciple's feet before sharing his last meal with them. After dinner, he goes into the garden to pray. On this evening he would give his disciples a new commandment: "As I have loved you, so you must love one another."

Join fellow Pullenites for a simple meal in Finlator Hall at 5:30 pm. and for a worship service with communion in the Chapel at 6:30 pm.

**Good Friday** – On Good Friday, Jesus watches public opinion turn against him and he is condemned to the brutality of the cross. Some stories just don't end well, and those that do often contain some hard chapters. Life doesn't always offer us time to acknowledge our pain and grieve our losses. Good Friday is a good opportunity to sit with our grief.

Consider visiting the labyrinth where you can walk with your grief, your questions, your fears and your hopes. The Chapel will be open from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm.

**Resurrection Sunday** – On Resurrection Sunday, or Easter, we reach the culmination of Holy Week. As the resurrected Christ makes many appearances, the disciples' grief turns into wonder at what else might be possible. If death and suffering must be a part of our story so must resurrection!

At 9:00 am, we will celebrate new life through the waters of baptism. At Pullen we celebrate baptism once a year. If you are interested in being baptized, please contact one of our ministers.

At 11:00 am, we will ring our bells at the sound of our alleluia's and "raise up new hope" for the life that is still springing forth.

May we be transformed as we draw near to Jesus this Holy Week.

### **Clothing and Toiletries for Migrant Farmworkers**

As we have for many years, Pullen Mission Women will be collecting toiletries and clothing to be distributed to farmworkers through the Episcopal Farmworker Ministry. Requested items include shampoo, deodorant, combs, toothbrushes (individually wrapped), toothpaste, dental floss, disposable razors (individually wrapped), shaving cream, acetaminophen (Tylenol), Lidocaine cream (Bengay, Icy Hot), insect repellant, sunscreen, hand towels, washcloths, men's work pants (sizes 30-34), long sleeve, light colored shirts, preferably cotton, shoes or work boots sizes 7-10, and socks. EFWM is also looking for regular clothes sizes S, M, and L for women and men, children's clothes, and baby clothes. # **Update from Building and Grounds**

Hello, fellow Pullenites. Our committee has been getting a lot of attention lately, particularly during discussions about our budget. We thought it would be good to keep you up to date with some of the work needed to keep our building in shape. To start, we are sharing the work items that were completed in 2023. Note that much of this work was actually performed by either outside contractors or our own Handy Corps.

- Multiple sections of tile roof and gutter repaired/replaced
- Repaired flashing on East tower
- White Flag facility implementation and support by Pullen staff
- Implemented treatment to address termites discovered during heating system repair
- Revised the Pullen Facility usage policy
- New chiller installation
- Cox Avenue Building parking lot sinkhole repair
- Pullen Chapel (plus walkway) solar panels installed and operational
- Pullen Boiler steam traps repaired
- Cox Avenue boiler is operational
- Pullen roof security system inspected and repaired
- SmartChurch/Pullen facilities assessment inspection, report, and subsequent entry into eSpace
- Addressed the west-side door security concern
- Repaired the glass for the window on the third floor, west-side
- GEMS accounting verified, B&G funding from GEMS confirmed and reserved
- Submitted a reasonable B&G Maintenance and Capital Reserve budget request

information about new work that is going on this year.

### **March HOST Update**

Two years ago, on February 28, I unlocked the door to one of the small offices near the Music Space on Pullen's first floor. I was the first employee for HOST, a new non-profit working to prevent homelessness for college students in Raleigh, and Pullen was supporting this vital program by providing free office space.

Since that day, HOST has supported 40 college students, helping them maintain or obtain permanent housing so they can continue their education. All students received financial assistance for needs such as rent, utilities, transportation, and food. Ten of those students have been hosted by community members for anywhere from a few days up to eight months (three of our host homes are Pullen families).

In April 2022, HOST moved to the large mission space near Finlator Hall. We now have a second staff member, the HOST Student Advocate, who provides case management support for the students in our

program, and we are working with Pullen's Missions and Outreach Council to host students in the church's guest space.

As HOST celebrates this milestone, we thank Pullen Church for their support over the past two years. HOST is looking forward to many more years of partnership with Pullen Church. To learn more about HOST, visit our website at www.hostnc.org.
